Preshow Script Notes	"A BRIGHT ROOM CALLED DAY is set entirely in AGNES' apartment, a small flat in a large 19th century apartment building in a low rent district in Berlin. The apartment has no more than three rooms. Only the main room is visble. It is cluttered, cozy, and has large windows. The set should be as uneasily realistic as the text is, and the apartment must be a room everyone would want to occupy. The ZILLAH interruptions take place in the apartment 57 years later, and something - lights or an actual physical change in the set - should connote the transformations of time."  "The photograph of the Nazi rally referred to in the stage directions is an actual photograph and can be obtained from the author."		AGNES: Mid to late 30s, preferably heavyset. Bit player / character acress in the German film industry. GREGOR BAZWALD (BAZ): Early to med 30s. Homosexual who works for the Berlin Institutue for Human Sexuality. PAULINKA ERDNUSS: Mid 30s but looks younger. Actress in the German film industry: a featured player on her way to becoming a minor star. ANNABELLA GOTCHLING: Mid 40s. Communist artist and graphic designer. VEALTNINC HUSC: Mid 40s. Cinematographer. Hungarian exile. Missing an eye, he wears spectacles with one lens blackened. ROSA MALEK: Mid to late 20s. Minor functionary of the KPD (Kommunistische Partei Deutschlands). EMIL TRAUM: Mid to late 20s. Slightly higher-ranking functionary of the KPD. DIE ALTE: A woman, very old but hard to tell how old -somewhere between 70 and dead-for-20-years. White face and rotten teeth. Dressed in a nightgown, once white but now soiled and food-stained. GOTTFRIED SWETTS: Ageless; when he looks good he could be 30, when he looks bad he could be 50 or more. Distinguished, handsome, blond, Aryan. ZILLAH KATZ: Contemporary American Jewish woman. 30s. BoHo/East Village New Wave with Anarcho-Punk tendencies. ROLAND: In his 20s, born in East Germany back when there was such a thing. Now hanging out in what was formerly West Berlin. AGNES denotes that it is midnight of the New Year, which means she needs some indication of time such as a clock.  GOTCHLING mentions coffee. This may be within the set as well.
